## Accessibility & the ERS

The word 'accessible' is used throughout all three of the ERS tools. According to the tool, accessible means children can reach and are allowed to use toys, materials, furnishings, and/or equipment. Toys in open storage such as open shelves must be within easy reach of children with no barriers (for example, a "no-touch" rule or containers with lids).

Keeping in mind the term 'accessible', think about your environment. How are you storing your materials? Can children freely grab and play? How can you make items more accessible?
